



# Speaking Section Directions



## Make sure your headset is on.

This section measures your ability to speak about a variety of topics. You will answer six questions by speaking into the microphone. Answer as completely as possible.

In questions 1 and 2, you will speak about familiar topics. Your response will be scored on your ability to speak clearly and coherently.

In questions 3 and 4, you will first read a short reading passage. This passage will go away, and you will then listen to a talk on the same topic. You will be asked about the information you have read and heard. You will need to combine information from the reading passage and the talk to provide a complete answer. Your response will be scored on your ability to speak clearly and coherently and how accurately you convey information about what you read and heard.

In questions 5 and 6, you will listen to part of a conversation or a lecture. You will be asked about what you have heard. Your response will be scored on your ability to speak clearly and coherently and how accurately you convey information about what you heard.

You may take notes while you read and while you listen to the conversations and lectures. You may use your notes to help prepare your response.

Listen carefully to the directions for each question. The directions will not be written on the screen.

For each question, you will be given a short time to prepare your response (15 to 30 seconds, depending on the question). A clock will show how much preparation time is remaining. When the preparation time is up, you will be told to begin your response. A clock will show how much response time is remaining. A message will appear on the screen on the screen when the response time has ended.

#### Reactance

There are times when one person may place a restriction on the behavior of another individual. When a rule limiting a person's behavior or actions is implemented, the affected person often feels that his or her freedom has been lessened. The person is then more likely to engage in the behavior or action that has been restricted. This type of behavior is known as reactance. It is a result of an affected individual demonstrating that he or she still possesses the free will and ability to make decisions of his or her own.
